Iridesce: The Living Apology Project

is a joint project of Affirm United/S'affirmer Ensemble and The United Church of Canada. It is funded by Mission & Service.

In 1988, the United Church of Canada affirmed that sexual orientation is not a barrier to full participation in the life and ministry of the church. These were truly historic words that were celebrated by people in our churches and beyond!



Almost 30 years later, although many consider us to be a justice-oriented church, we do not always practice the justice that we preach when it comes to lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, queer and Two-Spirit (LGBTQ2) people.

At General Council 42, the church voted to support the creation of a national project of sharing and dialogue to gather stories from people affected by our 1988 decision.

Who is invited to share their stories? Everyone. The whole church is invited to participate, not just LGBTQ2 people. This includes people who have attended or left a church, visited a church, volunteered, studied or worked in any United Church community of faith from 1925 to 1988 to today.
